Vicar's Viewpoint



In October I preached a sermon about the financial position of our church and the need to increase our

giving, and I also wrote about this in the December Outlook. I am really encouraged by your generous responses to this. When you include the added value of Gift Aid we have received so far:

- 12 one off donations, totalling over £5,500. As a result, the deficit at the end of last year was not as large as we feared.
- 8 new givers
- 19 givers who have increased their giving

The additional income gives us a total increase of £11,500 per year.

We were facing a shortfall of £17,000 - so we still have some way to go to balance our books, but I am now all the more convinced that we can close the remaining deficit of £5,500.

So I want to say a huge thank you to everyone who has responded so far. If you were thinking of increasing your giving but have not yet done so, I hope this good news will inspire you to take that step. Re-launching Messy Church

On 4th February we held our first Messy Church since before the pandemic. We were due to start at 3 pm but at that point we only had two children, and I was beginning to feel a bit despondent. Then a stream of parents and children began to arrive - some coming on straight from a children's party they had been attending. In the end we had a lovely group of children and parents, large enough for the hall to feel busy, and yet also intimate and happy. First we had a story from the Bible, and we learned some sign language to go with it. Then the children had a choice of craft activities: making their own Christingles; making badges; making a 'stained glass candle' (there are still a couple on the window in the Arkwright hall); and some

baking - the whole parish centre smelled delicious for hours afterwards. After that the children had a drink and some food, and we ended with singing and a magical Christingle service.

I want to say a special thank you to the wonderful team of helpers. Someone commented that the team worked so well it was hard to believe this was the first time we had worked together. I have to mention Giselle's appearance as a human-sized Christingle! I also want to thank Lynda Gwyther for passing on wisdom from her previous experience leading Messy Church.

The next Messy Church will be on Sunday 14th April, at 3 pm, with an Easter theme.

On Thursday after 2pm volunteers arrive in the Mellor War Memorial garden.

Yesterday Chris D was there and told me she was

delighted to have seen two **red polls** Carduelis flammea on their bird feeder, which is up Longhurst Lane before you get to Damsteads on the other side of the road. She was entranced by the male's



red on his head and chest. They feed together in the top of alder and birch trees extracting the tiny seeds. Their behaviour is very tit like, birds often hang upside down from the very end of branches. Their call is a fast chuchuchuh-uh.



In winter the books say the redpolls join up with siskins *Carduelis spinus* - and David K opposite the Rec had three **siskins** on his feeder. It is a dainty bird, acrobatic mainly yellow-green with bright yellow wing bars, rump and markings on the tail. The males have a black crown and bib. They like sunflower hearts and nyjer seed to eat. The nyjer seeds are

quite small so you need a special feeder for them. David also had two **parakeets** on his feeder, which he took a photo of and put on the local RSPB High Peak Birdwatching group facebook page.

At the end of January was The Big Garden Birdwatch for the RSPB. In an hour in my garden I saw, having landed, 1 long tail tit, 1 blackbird, 1 bluetit. 1 dunnock, 1 woodpigeon, 2 house sparrows and 4 jackdaws.

Flying over but not counted were 7 Canada geese, 2 starlings, 2 magpies and a charm of goldfinches.

P.S. Delighted to have seen a pair of **goosanders** on the North Lake by Lakes Road. First ones I've seen this year.

LGBTQ+ HISTORY MONTH EVENSONG SERMON "IN MY CHURCH ..." Rev Angie Stanton



I was listening to the radio last night when I heard a young lesbian, a Christian called Betty who wanted to start her own church because she hadn't been able to find a church that would truly welcome her and her partner. **Thank you** to your welcome to me for this privilege to reflect on the Church, History, Scripture, and THIS Church now.

Thank you, because this is personal for me, for some of you, for some of your children and grandchildren or for some of your friends, some who are not here and some online.

Thank you that we can reflect and celebrate without fear of humiliation or persecution which is happening in some countries and some churches across the world. The church has an inglorious history of having persecuted its own, forcing those who have worshipped, served and worked in the church into secrecy, into celibacy, into lying, into self-loathing – in order to remain in the church. It did it with a message that the God revealed to us in the Scriptures will not tolerate a man loving a man or a woman loving a woman or a woman becoming a man. It told us that this was SINFUL and that God wants to judge and punish,

The Church did it with a message that the God revealed to us in Scripture was above all things completely judgemental about what some people did with some parts of their body, some of the time.

I DON'T FIND THAT GOD IN MY BIBLE.

I find a God who says, 'In me in the Salvation I bring there is no longer male or female, no slave or free, no Jew nor Greek, no insiders or outsiders. You are all one in my sight. You are created in my image as I intended you to be.' - black/pink, tall/short, gay/straight/trans: blue-eyed/brown eye - I'd prefer you not to act in an angry or shouty way or a mean-spirited way, but you are as I intended you to be and I love you.

There are those people who have pointed to isolated verses in Scripture that condemn random acts of gay sex. They are there and

Scripture rightly condemns them - orgies and homosexual prostitution in the Temple. Yet they extrapolate from there to prove and conclude that God cannot bless faithful, stable, loving relationships, unless they are between a man and a woman. That God cannot, and does not bless them

I CAN'T FIND THAT GOD IN MY BIBLE....... I FIND A GOD WHO IS BLESSING EVERYWHERE.

Let's take this extraordinary story of David and Jonathan - the Shepherd boy and the King's son. A classic tale, of love, sadness, humiliation, courage, and lifelong commitment, two young men, soul mates. Can you spot the place where God judges and condemns, David and Jonathan? No. They kiss: they hold each other: they swear to love one another. Condemnation comes from Jonathan's father, Saul, who, because of his own sense of humiliation, wants to humiliate his son. God blesses them, protects them, and David goes on his way to become the great King of Israel.

THAT'S WHAT I FIND IN MY BIBLE.

Blessing is what God does, and has done from the beginning. Blessing is about celebrating, confirming, encouraging and protecting. Blessing is what the church must be doing. A church that has been blessing the unions of couples for years and has, as you know, liturgies for blessing homes, pets, and battleships, should surely now be officially blessing couples in loving, faithful, stable, gay, and alternative + relationships.

"Well, yes, we might be ready to do that," the Church of England says, "But let's not officially call it a blessing, let's say we are praying for people. And let's not do it as a special service on its own. Rather we will shoehorn it in after the third collect at Evensong or during the intercessions on Sunday morning."

Oh Lord do not expect us to be grateful for this because it's not enough - this creeping towards equality. It is a matter of justice. For in you there is no longer male or female, but only a call to love.

As you know, the Church of England is currently debating these things. It's two steps forward and two steps backwards, ready to tear itself apart over who's kissing who. It is hard to love that Church. But what

we are called to is to love each other, to understanding, genuinely welcoming, valuing the ministry of all - not making people feel like they need to hide their sexual orientation.

Then we can say to Betty who wants to set up her own church. "Look here, it's possible. We're not a Gay Church. We're a church that will push for Justice, speak up for Inclusion, normalise difference, celebrate our gay and trans members, stick our necks out, stick our flag up and campaign for Gay and alternative church weddings.

IN MY BIBLE, I find a God who loves justice and inclusion; who does not distinguish between Male and Female, who asks us to love and bear fruit and not be afraid. IN MY CHURCH I want to find a place of celebration, value and equality that makes all LGBTQ+ people feel welcome and seen.

There is no better place to make that happen than here and now.

I do not remember listening to a more memorable talk than the one you either heard in the Service or on You Tube or have, hopefully, just read. Its content and its presentation will remain with many of us for a very long time. Thank you Angie and Sian Ed.

Captain Ken



In the nineteen sixties one of the happiest ships on

which I sailed was the Blue Funnel cargo ship 'Rhexenor'. I was 3rd Officer there and we

sailed between Liverpool and Australia. We called at Fremantle, Adelaide, Hobart, Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane with lots and lots of time in each. It was always important in



that Company to allow plenty of time in the long Ocean voyages to exercise the life boats.

We had experienced a lot of bad weather, outward bound on this particular voyage, but the Captain was determined to carry out the drill before we arrived on the Australian coast, so I was a little surprised when he announced we would carry out the boat drill the following morning as we reached the coast before, later, arriving in Adelaide.

The reason I was so concerned was first because I was to be in charge of the boat, but on consulting the Admiralty chart, I realised the position the Captain had selected was just off Cape Catastrophe. It turned out that I had just finished reading the history of Matthew Flinders, and he was a particular hero of mine. He had named the point when he was surveying the entire Australian Continent. A sudden squall had struck his surveying boat with the loss of some eight crew members. However, despite my reservations, our Captain insisted that we would be luckier than Flinders and I'm pleased to say, we were, and our voyage was successful.

On that same voyage we berthed in Sydney near the old wool clippers' berth of Circular Quay. The Opera House was still to be built and somewhere near where it now stands was a hospital. The 'Rhexenor' held a party, and many of the nurses attended. During the party some of the nurses were telling us how their hospital, on the banks of Sydney harbour, had a lovely swimming pool but they

couldn't use it as the shark safety net had a large hole in it.

With my rather big mouth I promised we would bring our life boat the following day, and repair the shark net. Our



Captain was naturally pleased with the idea as it would be yet extra boat training. We arrived with our boat and after planting our red Ensign on the lawn commenced repairing the hole. The nurses were delighted and proud to keep our flag.

Naturally the 2nd Mate and his team decided to work from inside the pool, whereas my team were working from outside, with the sharks! I'm glad to say my luck held for the second time that voyage.



Trainee Vicaring Chapter 2: Epiphany Special Clare Jackson Time is racing by, even by normal standards, let alone by the gentle turning of the spheres that the Church runs on. Since Ch.1, we have had Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, all very special since I wasn't necessarily going to be with you still this time last year.

For me, each season is now accompanied by a College Residential; a weekend of pretty intense Ministerial Formation. This infuses the theology we do during the week and in assignments, with the breadth and reality of the task that priests undertake in ministering to, often these days several, communities. Outlook report on the PCC meeting of January 2024

Our first PCC meeting of the New Year took place on 29th January 2024. We're now holding our meetings in the Mellor Centre and for those who need to join us virtually.

The good news was that the Christmas Crib Services had gone well; five candidates had been confirmed by Bishop Sam on 14th January, and the first Messy Church since the pandemic was due to take place the following Sunday.

There were some ongoing issues concerning the church car park, and it was agreed that permanent notices were needed, to make it clear that it is church land and so is primarily for church usage. A wording will be agreed and then notices will be produced.

There was also a question about whether more spaces should be provided for disabled drivers. It was felt this was not necessary at the moment but it was agreed temporary disabled parking signs may be useful for big events such as weddings and funerals.

The General Synod of the Church of England approved of a suite of prayers, called 'Prayers of Love and Faith', which include prayers of thanksgiving, dedication and God's blessing for same-sex couples in a civil partnership or marriage. The Diocese of Chester recently circulated these prayers and each parish is asked to decide whether they agree they will be using these. The members of our PCC agreed unanimously that they will.

There was some initial discussion about planning for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), which takes place every year, and we agreed that this year it will be held on 19th May. We then had a visitor to the meeting – Tom Howling, our Director of Music, who came to give us the outcome of the consultation exercise that he carried out with the PCC in November. This was about his proposals to provide a flexible seating area at the back of the church, which would maximise seating capacity for the choir, and/or for congregations at large services. There were a number of

points that members had thought should be borne in mind, such as the seating being lightweight, but its visual appearance was important too, and that it may provide an opportunity to improve the access to the Lady Chapel. Andrew summarised that the PCC was in support of the plans, in principal, but they needed to be communicated to the congregation, who should be consulted as far as possible.

The Vicar's and Church Warden's bank accounts are historical charitable funds which were set up to aid the poor folk of Mellor, for such things as buying blankets. This money is now rarely used so has accumulated. It was agreed that we will donate £2,000 to the Wellspring, which is where local people may approach for support in hard times. Other ideas for using the money will be considered.

Finally, our Treasurer was able to inform us that, following our Vicar Andrew's Thanksgiving appeal, the church had received one-off donations totalling some £5,000, and parishioners had increased their regular giving to the church by around £11,500. This was excellent news, although the church still faces a large deficit and a further increase in giving is needed to keep our church running into the future.

(Women's) World Day of Prayer

The World Day of Prayer this year is on Friday 1st March and the service will be at 2.00 pm at Marple Methodist Church. The service has been arranged by the women of Palestine, so do join us to find out more about this beleaguered Christian community, and to pray

Lemon Tart

A lemon tart for Easter, this will feed a large family but you can make one two thirds the size if that suits better

6 large eggs 300 ml double cream 3 large lemons (4 small) preferably unwaxed zest and juice 280 grams caster sugar

- + Whisk the eggs, sugar, cream and lemon juice together, stir in the grated zest
- + Leave in the fridge for 2 days.
- + Make the tart case. Lining a 10 inch/ 24 cm flan tin, or buy a pre cooked pastry case.

My favourite sweet pastry

10.oz/ 280grams plain flour

1 oz/ 25g ground almonds or just use an extra ounce 25 grams

3 oz/75g icing sugar

6 oz butter.

1 egg and 1 yolk

1.

Either put all the ingredients in a food processor and bring to a dough or mix in a bowl. Chill in the fridge for a couple of hours.

- 2. Heat the oven to 200°C gas 6. Line the flan tin, making sure the pastry stands just slightly higher than the tin (or buy a pre-cooked pastry case).
- 3. Lightly prick the base with a fork. Chill for 30 minutes. Line with tart case with baking parchment and baking beans. Bake for 12- 15 minutes until the pastry is set.
- 4. Remove the beans and parchment and bake for a further 10 minutes until pale gold.
- 5. Reduce the temperature to 160°C /gas 3.
- 6. Stir the filling and pour most of it into the flan case. When it is in the oven top up further.
- 7. Bake 25 to 30 minutes until the filling is just set but has a slight wobble in the centre. Leave to cool before removing the flan tin. Can be served warm of cold. Dust with icing sugar which can be caramelised under a grill or using blow torch or simply served as it is.

GREEK TART ERROR from February Outlook. Spread the jam over the dough and top with either a lattice or some shapes cut with a biscuit cutter. Bake for 25 -30 minutes.


