Vicar's Viewpoint



Farewell to Clare Jackson

Before I started at Mellor I understood that Clare was training to be a Reader, and I was excited about the prospect of working with her. However by the time I arrived, she had been accepted for training for ordination. That would usually mean being placed in a new parish during the training. You can imagine my disappointment - Clare would be leaving Mellor just as I started. However I am delighted that in this case an exception was made, so we have been blessed to have Clare with us for three more years. It has been a joy to watch her grow in confidence and ministerial skills during this time. Clare is a great colleague and it has been a privilege for me to work with her.

Clare is now coming to the end of her training and will start work as curate-in-charge of the Benefice of Weston, near Crewe. Because the diocese also thinks very highly of her, they are asking her to go straight into a position of leadership rather than the traditional curacy as a kind of apprentice working with another vicar. Please pray for her as she prepares for this exciting and daunting new responsibility.

We will say farewell to Clare on Sunday 21st June. There will be a presentation during the 10 am service and cake afterwards. And Clare's very final service with us will be at 6.30 pm choral evensong that same day, after which we'll drink a toast to Clare with something bubbly.

Clare's ordination is on Sunday 5th July at 10.30 am in Chester cathedral. There will be no services in Mellor church that morning as we are encouraging people to go to Chester to support Clare. There will be a coach leaving at around 8.15 am (cost approximately £15). There are still a few places left. If you want to come, sign up on the list in church asap or let me know and I'll add your name.

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Mellor Birds



At the monthly High Peak RSPB meeting in Marple someone had heard Green Woodpeckers laughing in the field above Bottoms Hall on the way to Linnet Clough.

As I don't like violent programmes I won't tell you what Hilary said about her bird box with eight blue tit chicks inside and a visiting greater spotted woodpecker. I will only say that there are only 3 blue tit chicks now. Hilary was devastated.

The Fête Shower on a very wet evening did not dampen anyone's spirits. Lynda J, after buying her raffle tickets from Lynda G, told me she has a crow's nest in her roof on Fernwood and the crow family wakes her up at 5.30 every morning. Her husband was wanting to rehome the noisy crows but kind, caring Lynda would have none of it. She is waiting for peace to resume and then will clear out the nest. Carrion Crows are entirely black with blue and green gloss. They are fairly easy to identify from their call which is kaaaw kaaaw kaaaw. There always seems to be just three kaaws – sounding like they are throwing up their stomach contents. Unlike rooks who like to nest together, crows nest alone. After leaving the nest the brown-black juveniles follow their parents, dependent on them for several weeks for food.



The day after the Fête Shower Lynda sent me a super photo of a pink spoonbill she had taken recently in Florida. Apparently the land around Cape Canaveral launch pad has no buildings but does have wonderful bird life. You can buy a ticket to drive 7 miles along the Blackpoint wildlife Drive in Titusville Florida. This was where the photo was taken. So if you are going to Disneyland, this would be a close by, great day out.

Mellor Archaeological Trust Update



The Trust was formed in 2000 when excavations on the Old Vicarage site were at their height. The trust was formed by John and Ann Hearle whose garden held all the secrets of the Iron Age settlement and Medieval Hall at Mellor. Other projects followed notably with the excavation of the Mellor Mill site (Oldknow's Mill) . This excavation was managed by Bob Humphrey - Taylor who sadly died recently. Bob was a leading light in the promotion of the mill site and other heritage sites in Mellor and Marple.

The Trustees of Mellor Archaeological Trust are keen to continue the work of the Hearles and Bob and are planning for the future. We are currently looking at the possibility of rebuilding the Iron Age round house situated in the field behind the Old Vicarage. The land owner is keen for this to happen and is supporting the project. This will be subject to successful grant applications and sourcing the skilled work force.

We have recently become aware of an unrecorded early industrial site in the area which may give us the opportunity for a small excavation. Meanwhile, the Roman Lakes Leisure Park continue to host Archaeological Talks on the third Sunday of the month. Check local notice boards and Facebook for up to date information.

The trust is currently looking to appoint new trustees. We are in need of a treasurer as our current treasurer has reached the age of 90 and understandably would like to retire.

Mazarin Cake

This is a cake referred to in a book I was reading 'When the Cranes Fly South'. A friend made the cake and this is her recipe. I am going to suggest you serve it plain, or as part of dessert with fresh berries and Greek yoghurt, crème fraîche or whipped cream on the side.

This makes a large cake so do divide by two and make a smaller one.

200g ground almonds

150g caster sugar

150g icing sugar

150g softened butter

2 tsp almond extract

1 tsp vanilla essence

4 eggs

100g plain flour

50g cornflour

2 tsp baking powder

Line a 23cm / 9 inch tin

Preheat the oven to 175°C Gas 4

Using a food mixer if you have one (otherwise elbow grease) beat the sugars, butter, extracts and ground almonds. Beat in the eggs one at a time, combine the flours and baking powder and mix in, do not over mix.

Pour into a prepared cake tin and bake for 35 to 40 minutes until a skewer comes out clean.

Cool before eating or adding topping.

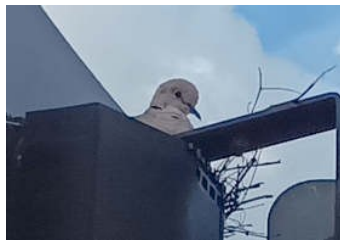




Marple Birds

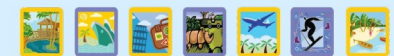

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There But for Fortune

I was in the X-ray department at our local hospital recently when a chap was wheeled into the waiting area. He was handcuffed to the wheelchair, had no shoes on, almost completely covered with a blue blanket, and accompanied by two police officers. As I watched him being brought in, I recalled to mind the Phil Ochs song recorded by Joan Baez in 1965, 'There but for Fortune'. For those people not familiar with the lyrics, I will print them here:

Show me the prison, show me the jail
Show me the prisoner whose life has gone stale
And I'll show you a young man with so many reasons why
There but for fortune go you or I, mm-mm

Show me the alley, show me the train
Show me the hobo who sleeps out in the rain
And I'll show you a young man with so many reasons why
There but for fortune go you or I, mm

Show me the whiskey stains on the floor
Show me the drunkard as he stumbles out the door
And I'll show you a young man with so many reasons why
There but for fortune go you or I, mm

Show me the country where the bombs had to fall
Show me the ruins of the buildings once so tall
And I'll show you a young land with so many reasons why
There but for fortune go you and I
You and I

Play it on YouTube and you may appreciate why it was such a popular record at the time, and reached number 8 in the UK Music Chart.

So when you compile your gratitude diary at bedtime, be it handwritten or just in your head, it would be well to remember the words of this song. We none of us can choose our parents, or the environment we are born into, and personally I feel very fortunate on both of these accounts.

The Book That Changed My Faith...

The majority of Christians would probably assume I am referring to the Bible; but I am not. It was a different book, an autobiography that had a profound impact on my faith. In fact, before I read the book, I actually saw a film version of "*The Hiding Place*". This told the true story of a Dutch Christian family who risked everything to rescue Jews in occupied Holland. Sadly, the group was betrayed by an informer and most were arrested and imprisoned.

The two sisters at the heart of the story, Corrie and Betsie, eventually ended up in a concentration camp. Yet even there they found ways to spread the Gospel of Christ. But Corrie ten Boom had to suffer the death of her beloved sister before her own eventual release from captivity. She then dedicated her life to preaching the Gospel of forgiveness and love for your enemy that had helped her to survive.



But one day she spoke to a German church. After her talk, a man approached to thank her. To her horror, she recognised him as one of the SS guards from the camp. Her instant feelings were of hatred and anger, yet she knew that he too was one of God's children. She prayed for the power to forgive him. Nothing happened. So she prayed a second time: "Lord Jesus, I cannot forgive him. Give me your forgiveness." At last she was able to shake the man's hand and even feel some love for him.

Why did this incident strike a chord with me? I came out of that cinema a haunted person. For I knew deep down I had never forgiven someone who had hurt me in the past. For days I avoided my Christian friends and made excuses to miss church. Until one day, with feelings of hurt and anger churning inside me, I knelt down and prayed the prayer Corrie had used.

On my own I lacked the power to forgive: that came from Jesus alone. The next day I went to my Christian friends and confessed how short-sighted I had been. At last I had discovered what *"The Hiding Place"* was trying to tell me: "that it is not on our forgiveness any more than our goodness that the world's healing hinges, but on His. When He tells us to love our enemies He gives, along with the command, the love itself".

If you read only one book this summer, please make it this one (there is a copy in the Church library – just look in the Quiet Room in the Parish Centre, or ask to borrow my copy). You never know it might just change your faith for good.

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AS SEEN FROM COW CORNER

In the wisdom of the cricket league fixture secretary, it was decreed that Mellor would play their first three matches away from home.



The first match was not very far from the Longhurst Lane ground, indeed at Compstall, just a mere bus ride away. On winning the toss, the home captain invited the visitors to take first knock on the newly laid strip. The Mellor batsmen must have been suffering from being laid up for the six months over winter, as none of them could muster double figures, apart from a lower order batsman who was left not out on 23, with extras amassing 10. The resultant target, for Compstall was 77. The Mellor bowling attack did, however, make inroads into the Compstall batting in capturing five wickets, but the home side did reach the target in 26 overs.

The next match took the bruised Mellor players, keen to redeem themselves, to Toft, whose captain won the toss and decided to bat first. Runs came steadily with most of the batsmen contributing, before the innings closed in the thirty seventh over on 148. This target was challenging, so that the batsmen had to adhere to the task in hand, and indeed redemption was achieved when Mellor reached the target with seven wickets down, ably assisted by a 62 not out, and who completed a fine all round performance following a five wicket haul in Toft's innings.

The third away game was again fairly local, at Offerton. The home captain won the toss and inserted Mellor, who following on from the previous week's runfest, reached a very acceptable 192 for the loss of eight wickets in their allotted forty overs, and which included a couple of fifties. The Mellor bowlers thought that they could be smug with a target of nearly five an over, but they had not reckoned on a blistering attack by the Offerton opening batsman, who hit the winning runs in reaching exactly 100 not out in the thirty fifth over.

The first home match for Mellor was against Disley, and against brooding skies, decided to bat first. After fifteen deliveries, there was a downpour of biblical proportions, which rendered any further play impossible. The game was therefore abandoned, and the players naturally decided to repair to the bar and ruminate on what might have happened and on the season to date.

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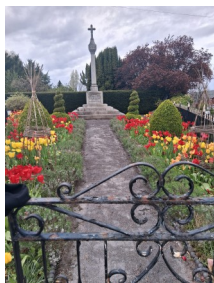

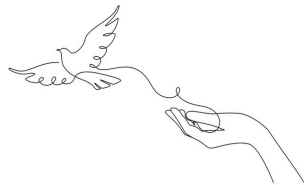
